The Quest for Spirituality by Earle M.

A good number of years ago, I found myself bewildered and uncertain about the meaning of spirituality and how one achieves it. After a rather frantic search, I fell upon an idea that presented a solution. I realized that by combining Step Twelve, Tradition Twelve, and the last sentence of the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, I had discovered my answer. Let me explain. Step Twelve says: "Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs."

To me, Step Twelve says that a thorough digestion of the previous eleven Steps constitutes a concept that could be considered "spiritual." I reviewed each step and indeed, found that by embracing all of these Twelve Steps, I obtained a feeling which I call spiritual. The last part of Step Twelve adds additional clout. It includes two vital points which make spirituality ring loud and clear within me. By carrying the message to others and practicing the principles of the AA program in all our affairs, Step Twelve rounds itself out for me into a full concept of spirituality.

However, there still seemed to be something missing. Very shortly thereafter I reread Tradition Twelve, which was of enormous help to me in my search for spirituality. Tradition Twelve says: "Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities." It became abundantly clear to me that anonymity was a spiritual foundation not only of Tradition Twelve, but of sobriety itself. When I grasped this concept, it became easy for me to place principles before personalities. As a matter of fact, once anonymity was embraced, the phrase "placing principles before personalities" became unnecessary—it had already happened.

One day, while I was reading the book, <u>Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions</u>, its last sentence jumped out at me and entered my awareness as I read: "We are sure that humility, expressed by anonymity, is the greatest safeguard that Alcoholics Anonymous can ever have." It followed that humility, as expressed through anonymity, was the greatest safeguard I could ever have. Thus, anonymity and humility were the core of spirituality—and of Step Twelve and Tradition Twelve. The AA program suggested that we carry this message

to other alcoholics and practice these principles in all our affairs. The latter is a big order, but in light of anonymity, humility. spirituality, it became easy to work with others both inside and outside of AA. Now spirituality took on a real, true meaning for me.

Many ask, "What is anonymity?" and "What is humility?" To me, they are almost the same thing. They are devoid of prestige; they demand nothing, they don't ask to be "right"; they simply suggest that the icy egocentric elements in all of us retire into the background and that we wear the warm cloak of anonymity and humility and therefore, spirituality.

What Humility Means to Me by Lynn T.

The best description of humility I've heard in the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous: Humility is remaining teachable.

I have come to believe that in any situation I truly do not know what is best. What I have come to believe in is the conviction that in this very moment God is present. The Big Book says, "God alone can judge our situation". What that means for me is simply, I do not have the same picture as God. All I need is the willingness, the willingness to let go of my idea, my picture, in any situation and to ask for his loving guidance.

That is an act of remaining teachable.

The acknowledgement of not knowing opens me for the miracle to happen.

There is a place in you where the strength of God abides. Within each of us there is a place where all knowledge, all love and all peace reside. That is where God resides in each of us.

Humility is living from that place.

The Seventh Step is where we make the change in our attitude which permits us, with humility as our guide, to move out from ourselves toward others and toward God.

I am especially aware of this Step because I'm now able to be useful to God and to my fellows. I know that He has granted me strength to do His bidding and has prepared me for anyone, and anything, that comes my way today. I am truly in His hands, and I give thanks for the joy that I can be useful today.

Daily Reflections, July 8

Surrender and Self-Examination

My stability came out of trying to give, not out of demanding that I receive.

Thus I think it can work out with emotional sobriety. If we examine every disturbance we have, great or small, we will find at the root of it some unhealthy dependency and its consequent unhealthy demand. Let us, with God's help, continually surrender these hobbling demands. Then we can be set free to live and love; we may then be able to Twelfth Step ourselves and others into emotional sobriety.

The Language Of the Heart, p.238

Years of dependency on alcohol as a chemical mood-changer deprived me of the capability to interact emotionally with my fellows. I thought I had to be self-sufficient, self-reliant, and self-motivated in a world of unreliable people. Finally I lost my self-respect and was left with dependency, lacking any ability to trust myself or to believe in anything. Surrender and self-examination while sharing with newcomers helped me to ask humbly for help.



A Lesson in Humility

I had to make an amends last week. A couple of my homegroup members want to bring the tickets back to our meeting. You know the kind I mean: when you enter the meeting someone hands you a raffle ticket, and if the leader calls your number, you are invited to come up and share. I have an issue with the tickets. For some reason, God gave me a systems-analyst brain. I encounter a situation, say a school performance, and my brain goes into overdrive, thinking, If they did it this way, it would work better! My brain is constantly assessing conditions and issuing modifications. With the tickets, when the leader calls the number of someone who doesn't respond, my brain shrieks, You're wasting time! Someone (me for instance) could be sharing right now! So when they brought the issue up at the business meeting, I lost all sense of humility and letting go and lapsed into know-it-all, alcoholic behavior. I urged other members to vote against the tickets. I spoke vehemently about the waste of time, and the uncomfortable feeling of the poor newcomer who doesn't want to be put on the spot to share. I even interrupted another homegroup member while she was speaking her point. Someone else had to tell me "Be Quiet, Lisa!"

I knew my disruption was uncalled for, so I called the woman I had interrupted and apologized. But I still felt uncomfortable. Something wasn't right. After all, the stupid tickets had already been voted out of our meeting. The battle of the tickets is still waging, and I don't like to lose, especially when I am right.

So I did what my sponsor tells me to do in these situations, when I am stirred up, and seething with righteousness: take it to God, and write about it. I asked God to help me out, and figure out a way that together God and I could make these other women see the light and the futility of those stupid tickets. I began to think about tickets, and thought back to the week before when I received a different kind of ticket, you know, the traffic variety.

I had been driving and talking to my passenger. I slowed down for the stop sign, not seeing any cars in the intersection; I was going to do my usual rolling-stop-and-go. After all, it is a serious waste of gas to keep braking and accelerating, especially when no one is there. I glanced over to my right, and my old police-alarm slammed my foot onto the brake when I saw the motorcycle cop. Good thing I stopped in time, before I was in the intersection. The cop saw me, flipped his lights on and indicated to me to pull over. Whaaa? I stopped! As he gleefully wrote my

ticket for being over the limit line, he looked me in the eye and said, "You weren't even going to stop until you saw me." At the time, my brain went on the defensive. *You can't*

give me a ticket for what you thought I might do! Good thing I've learned to keep my mouth shut when something clicked. My thinking was causing me to act in ways that were creating problems for me. The realization came that my cop alarm only activated because my conscience—my direct link to God-knew I was doing something wrong! Full of alcoholic ego and an attitude of "my way is the best way," I was puffed up with pride and arrogance. I was overly attached to the outcome at my homegroup, assuming the meeting should be conducted the way I believed was best for everybody. I was out-thinking traffic engineers: Stop signs at empty intersections should be construed as Yield signs instead. I was completely shutting God out and trying to run the show myself. I was not being humble.

What if there is supposed to be an uncomfortable silence in the meeting when someone doesn't respond to their number being called? And why do I think that pause is uncomfortable? Maybe God is giving us some extra quiet time, so we can listen for that still small voice that He speaks to us in. Maybe God is telling me to slow down, be still, let it be. Relax, God is in charge. As it is written, whenever I am uncomfortable, there is something going on with me. Yeah, I was not being humble. When the vote comes up next month, I think I'd better abstain and let God's will be done. That'll show them.

Humility for Today June 1961

There can be no absolute humility for us humans. At best, we can only glimpse the meaning and splendor of such a perfect ideal. As the book <u>Alcoholics Anonymous</u> says: "We are not saints...we claim spiritual progress rather than spiritual perfection." Only God himself can manifest in the absolute, we human beings must live and grow in the domain of the relative. We seek humility for today.

Therefore our practical question is this: "Just what do we mean by 'humility for today' and how do we know when we have found it?

We scarcely need be reminded that excessive guilt or rebellion leads to spiritual poverty. But it was a very long time before we knew we could go even more broke on spiritual pride. When we early AAs got our first glimmer of how spiritually prideful we

could be, we coined the expression: "Don't try to get too damned good by Thursday!" That old-time admonition may look like another of those handy alibis that can excuse us from trying our best. Yet a closer view reveals just the contrary. This is our AA way of warning against prideblindness, and the imaginary perfections that we do not possess.

The alarming thing about such pride-blindness is the ease with which it is justified. But we need not look far to see that this deceptive brand of self-justification is a universal destroyer of harmony and love. It sets person against person, nation against nation. By it, every form of folly and violence can be made to look right, and even respectable. Of course it is not for us to condemn. We need only investigate ourselves.
